This past weekend James McVey and I attended the Secretaries and Treasurer's retreat held in San Ramon. Having attended last year, I knew a little about the weekend's program and what to expect. However, I was surprised to learn of a major upgrade to iMember and how it will positively impact our fraternity. There

will be a roll out of the upgraded program for 2024.

This change happened because enough of us spoke up about the need to upgrade the application. The Fraternity uses iMember to track member and new prospect data such as contact and family information, dates members were initiated, passed, and raised as well as reference materials, including the California Masonic Code and the Grand Master's itinerary. The upgrade will allow us to run reports, such as past Hiram awardees, officer degree participation, and special event invitation and attendance lists. We can also create email or mail-merge documents targeting specific groups, such as lodge widows or Past Masters. Overall, these improvements will save us a lot of time and create more opportunities to reach out and strengthen our relationships with members and others who are important to us.

My favorite new feature is the list of all local lodge events wherever you are within the US. For example, if you are travelling to Arlington, Texas, the "Find Meetings" function will list all local lodge events based on your "geo location" or a typed in specific location.

The roll-out is available for secretaries just now and general membership shortly. The system is only as good as the data we put in so remember to update your contact information, add a partner or spouse. You can access iMember by going to:

<u>Oakland Lodge No. 61 Scholarships:</u> The Lodge offers a limited number of undergraduate college scholarships. The children and grandchildren of Lodge members in good standing have first priority, followed by Nieces, Nephews, Great Nieces and Great Nephews and active members of Jobs Daughters, DeMolay and Rainbow Girls from Alameda or Contra Costa Counties.

These scholarships are for a maximum of \$16,000 payable over 4 years toward an undergraduate college education. The Scholarship Board of the Lodge administers the scholarships and is accepting applications March 1 to May 15 of this year for undergraduate college scholarships.

One makes a single payment of the amount equal to the Lodge's annual dues at the time of purchase of the life membership multiplied by the factor indicated opposite the member's age in the following schedule:

Age 49 and under, a factor equal to or greater than 24 times annual dues 50 to 54 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 20 times annual dues 55 to 59 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 18 times annual dues 60 to 64 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 16 times annual dues 65 to 71 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 14 times annual dues Age 72 and over, a factor equal to or greater than 12 times annual dues.
